- \* Game terrine served with plum and ginger chutney and toasted brioche £6.95

#### MAINS

- \* Char-grilled 9oz steak burger with bacon & mozzarella served in a

bun with salad & chips. £9.95 (M/MW/WD)

- \* Fishcakes (Salmon, smoked haddock & potato) with a beef tomato & spring onion salad & a lemon mayo. £8.95
- \* Half shoulder of English lamb with a Dijon mustard & brioche herb crust served with thyme & redcurrant sauce served with roasted vegetables & dauphinoise potatoes. £14.95
- \* Chicken breast marinated in lemon, garlic and thyme on a spring onion mash finished with a rich wild mushroom sauce and served with seasonal vegetables. £13.95
- \* Kentish bangers & mash served with onion gravy. £9.95
- \* Pan fried fillet of wild sea bass served with and clam chowder on a bed of fresh saffron linguine £14.50
- \* Char-grilled scotch fillet steak £2.50/ounce or sirloin £2.10/ounce served with a peppercorn sauce, salad & chips.

### Fencing

They're at work again – the Council are now replacing the fencing between us and the basketball court with something a bit stronger. They should also be putting something underneath the fencing on the East boundary to try and prevent foxes coming in, but don't hold your breath.....

### Pavilion

Many of you will be aware that, although we have a lease from the Borough Council for the Bowling Green, we do not have one for the associated Pavilion. This is mainly because we don't want to be responsible for the maintenance and up-keep of it (there have been quite a few broken windows in the last couple of years).

Because of this the Council have been looking for another organisation to use it and have agreed that the Kent Youth Service will be able to do so from early in the New Year. A Youth Worker will be based there on a nearly full-time basis. An office will be created in the

screened off area to the right of the entrance. They will focus on the needs of the youth and will be supported by other professional staff as needed.

We have had a meeting with the Youth Service and agreed to leave sufficient equipment in the locked office to continue playing on the Bowling Green without having to fetch everything from the main clubhouse. We should still be able to use the drinks making facility on a shared basis. Unfortunately, because we have less control over security we recommend that members *do not* leave any items of their own in the Pavilion.

The Youth Service also understand that when we're not playing croquet they can use the Bowling Green for activities which don't damage the grass; even perhaps playing croquet!

It's not planned that the Pavilion will be a general meeting place for the youth of Tunbridge Wells, although they will use it from time to time. The Youth Service will be putting up posters etc., but some of these may be graphic. So please be warned that you may find some of these offensive.

We hope we will be able to work amicably with the Youth Service and that we can even persuade some youngsters to join our club....

### **Penshurst Place**

We've had an invitation to demonstrate croquet here on 20<sup>th</sup> July from 12pm – 4:30pm, thanks to Mike Greagsby. This is a new location for us and a good donation will recognise the efforts we hope you will all be making on this occasion.

There were no League matches until mid-June last year, so rather than reserve all dates for League games and only organise Friendlies after we've sorted these out we're initially reserving April and May for Friendlies. We hope this will help smooth their organisation.
